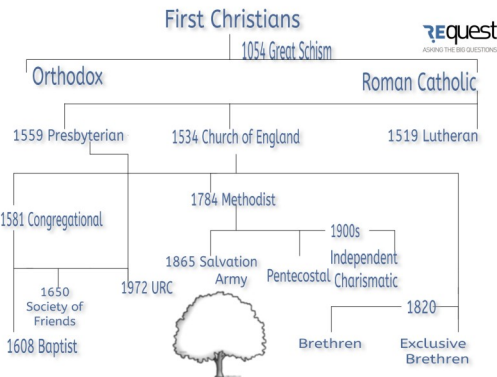


Christianity

Christianity	The religion followed by Christians.
Jesus	The founder of Christianity. Christians believe he was/is the son of God and that he came to Earth to teach people about God's message.
Ten Commandments	Ten rules given by God for people to live by. They can be found in the Old Testament of the Bible. Christians try to live by these rules and not break them.
The Bible	The Christian Holy Book is called the Bible. It has two parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament. There are over 66 books inside the Bible, which contain letters, laws, poems and stories.
The Trinity	The Three separate forms that God is known by. There is one God but He is three separate people: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
